Nursing programme commenced. These programmes are run in affiliation to Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University. Besides these University programmes our General Nursing & Midwifery programme also contin-



ues to run. All our Nursing programmes are duly recognized by Indian Nursing Council and Delhi Nursing Council. We have reservation of seats for Christian candidates in our courses as per our status as Christian Minority educational institution.

The Leprosy Mission (TLM) Hospital, Shahdara was established in the year 1984. The Leprosy Mission Trust India started the hospital as a leprosy control unit. Later it was developed into a tertiary leprosy care hospital. Thereafter, it was transformed into a community hospital. It caters to the urban population around Shahdara.

A total of 42 Nursing students, i.e., 26 students of GNM 2nd year, 11 students of P.B.B.Sc. 1st year, 1 student of M. Sc 1st year and 4 students of M. Sc 2nd year went for a one-day field visit to TLM Hospital on 11th March 2022.

A session about TLM Hospital, its vision, mission and leprosy were conducted by Dr Prashant, Public Health Consultant. He gave a brief introduction about the consultants, departmental heads and staff members of the Hospital. A short movie on Leprosy was shown to the students in the meeting room. After the movie
